Branchline service.

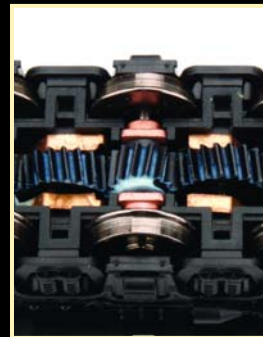
As railroads began switching from steam to diesel power, many found the new engines were a bit too heavy for the lighter rail and bridges found on branchlines. To meet these operating conditions, ALCO offered buyers a six-axle version of its popular RS-2 roadswitcher, cataloged as the RSC-2, which spread the weight over more wheels.

Equally at home working freight and passenger runs, many were purchased for a specific branch where they spent most of their working lives.
